CALL FOR PAPERS

The [University of Strasbourg](#) and the [BETA research laboratory](#) are delighted to announce a one-day workshop dedicated to the recent developments of DSGE models to be held the 22nd May 2023 in Strasbourg.

Dynamic and Stochastic General Equilibrium models have become a benchmark in theoretical dynamic macroeconomics, used both in the academic and institutional sectors. The severe criticisms addressed to this class of model in the aftermath of the 2007 financial crisis led to a global research agenda geared towards the improvement of these models in several directions: introduction of imperfect financial markets, heterogeneous agents, non-rational expectations process, etc. Researchers and practitioners have improved the existing toolkit for quantitative macroeconomics, for both economic policy analysis and forecasting.

This workshop aims at bringing together researchers in this field to exchange about their last contributions based on DSGE models. All topics are welcome (fiscal, monetary and macro-prudential policies, international macroeconomics, financial macroeconomics, macroeconomics of climate change, labor market topics, new quantitative methods, etc.).

The workshop is open to both young and experienced researchers, Ph.D. students, post-doctoral researchers, and professionals from business, government and non-governmental institutions.

Participants are expected to prepare a brief discussion on another paper within the session. All presentations and discussions will be in English.
